VENUE AND LOGISTICAL INFORMATION

The venue of the Summer School is located in the exact centre of the ancient city of Naples.

- From the Central Train Station, the university is easily reached by a 20-minute walk or by Metro Station (*line A – Garibaldi*; stops: Dante -8-minute walk - or Università - 10-minute walk).
- The university is also well connected with the International Airport of Naples Capodichino (NAP) by using the Alibus shuttle bus to the Central Train Station and the Metro Station (*line A*).
- From the harbour (both Molo Beverello and Molo Angioino), the university is easily accessible to the Metro Station (*line A Municipio*).


